

All the students were amazed with his speech which kept them engaged for the entire session of 3 hours. Mr. Srikanth Bolla spread his vigilance by saying 'Fortune favours the brave - that working with compassion and will power only serves the purpose. He reached his goals and more than that with his passion and a zeal to prove himself to the world which once neglected him and humiliated him for his disability. The children took in a great deal of inspiration when he proved the very saying IMPOSSIBLE itself says I'M POSSI-BLE" by studying in MIT, Stanford, by setting up a support service platform to rehabilitate, nurture and integrate differently - abled people in the society and by reaching to such a position in the societhat a Biopic named 'SRI' is filmed on his life story. Sagi Sree Hari Varma, an alumnus of Sri Prakash, presently a cinematographer from the USC school of cinematic arts, Los Angeles, interacted with the students of Sri Prakash enlightening them about the various fields that could be linked with cinematography. 








Curricular Activities




Curricular Activities
