





Financial Literacy Seminar for Teachers



Field Marshal Sam Hormusji Framji Jamshedji Manekshaw, (4 April 1914 -27 June 2008), widely known as Sam Manekshaw and Sam Bahadur, was the Chief of the Army Staff of the Indian Army during the Indo-Pakistani War of 1971, and the first Indian Army officer to be promoted to the rank of field marshal. He is widely regarded as the architect of India's victory during the 1971 Indo-Pakistani war.


